Prayer Scavenger Hunt

Power – This week's scavenger hunt is to find a battery somewhere in the house! This could be a new one or one you've pinched from the remote control (just remember to put it back again when you've used it for this reflection!) We have recently invested a significant amount of money into buying dozens of rechargeable batteries. With all the children's toys that require different sizes of battery it felt like a shrewd move. It is important to keep batteries charged whether this is on your phone or laptop, electric shaver or some other device or whether you just keep some spare in the house for the remote control, smoke alarm or clock. I'm sure we can all think of a time when a battery has run out at the most inopportune of moments

Acts 1:8 says this; "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

The disciples were promised that they would receive power to witness and share God's word throughout their local area (Jerusalem), the wider community (Judea), among those who did not like them, or share their faith (Samaria) and many others yet to receive God's word (The ends of the earth). Can you think of a time you have felt God's power with you so tangibly giving you the bravery and courage to share something of your faith with others? In times like this, can you think of ways in which you can carry out this commissioning even whilst unable to see others in the same way as we are used to? Who first shared the message of good news to you and how did you respond to this at first? Has this changed over time? Pause to consider these questions before we pray.

Lord, we praise you that you created the world to reflect your love and truth and that everything in the world relies on you for its life. We praise you that when we turned away from you in our self-centeredness and self-sufficiency, you did not reject us or turn your back on all that you had made. We praise you that your love for your creation never ends and that it has no limits. We praise you that your love reaches out to seek and to save a lost world and broken lives; that in Christ you have demonstrated your mercy and your understanding of who and what we are and what we are not. We praise you for the good news of his life, death and resurrection and that this is the message that you have called and commissioned us to make known. Lord, we cannot praise you too much and we cannot offer too much worship for all you have done for us in and through Jesus Christ. We praise you that through your Holy Spirit we can know your presence and power within our hearts and lives, and we can know what it means to be made new. We praise you for who you are, our great and glorious sovereign Lord. We pray that you will take our words of praise and by your Holy Spirit transform them into words and deeds that bring you glory for ever. In the name of Christ, the King of the kingdom. Amen. Josh
